The National Park Service <u>estimated</u> that the 16-day government shutdown of 2013 led to over **\$500 million** in lost visitor spending nationwide.





PARK PERKS



This week's <u>article</u>, published in the journal *Nature* this August, investigates the influence of protected area (PA) presence and spatial extent on tropical biodiversity in Southeast Asia. Dividing PAs into small (≤500 km²) and large (>500 km²) groups, the authors collected mammal diversity data from 1,365 camera stations across 65 sites, while bird diversity was assessed using 1,079 sampling locations from the online eBird database.

Biodiversity Benefits of Tropical Protected Areas



In addition to finding that PAs positively impact tropical biodiversity, the study suggests that *large PAs in particular* help to foster vertebrate biodiversity **beyond their borders**.
